- The drainage from the two easterly quad units located on the northern two thirds З. of Outlot B shall have an inverted crown to contain this drainage within the paved

area, or a small berm be constructed to confine the storm runoff to the driveways and prevent runoff from flowing into the Malcolm Ave. backyard.
